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INTRODUCTION

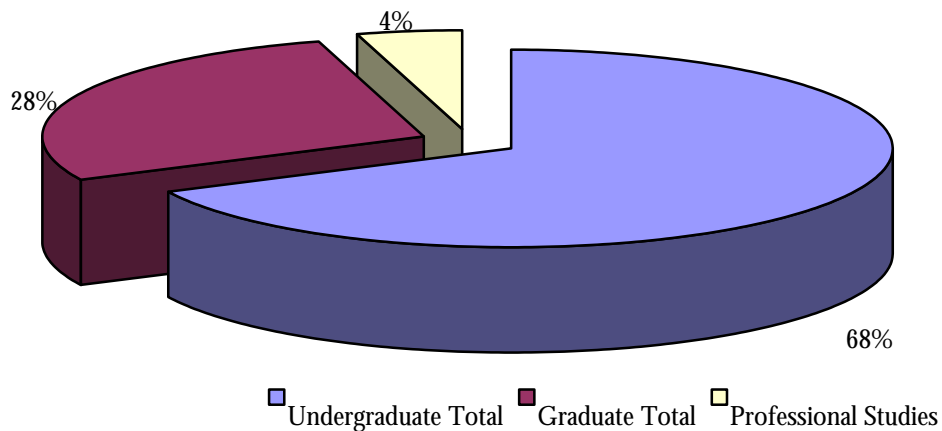
Gallaudet University's total enrollment for fall 1999 is 1,945. This includes 1,318 undergraduate, 541 graduate, and 86 professional studies students. This report does not include those students enrolled in the English Language Institute. Many of the tables in this report focus on the 1,203 degree-seeking undergraduate and 382 degree-seeking graduate students.

A number of new charts and tables have been introduced in this year's report, and the Office of Institutional Research expects to make further changes to this report in the future. Suggestions for how the content and format of this report could be improved are welcome from members of the Gallaudet community.

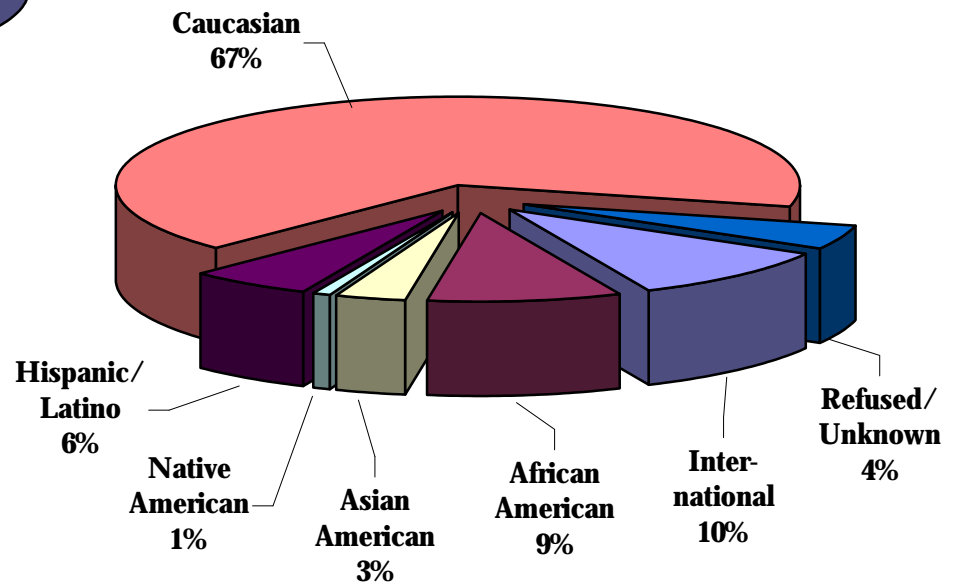
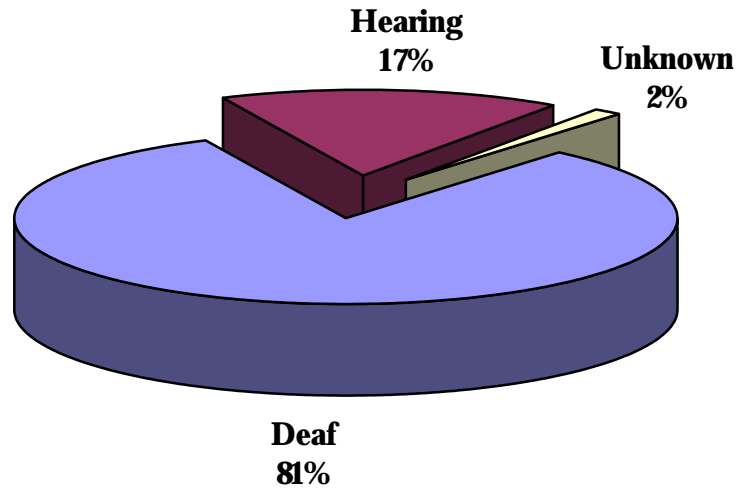

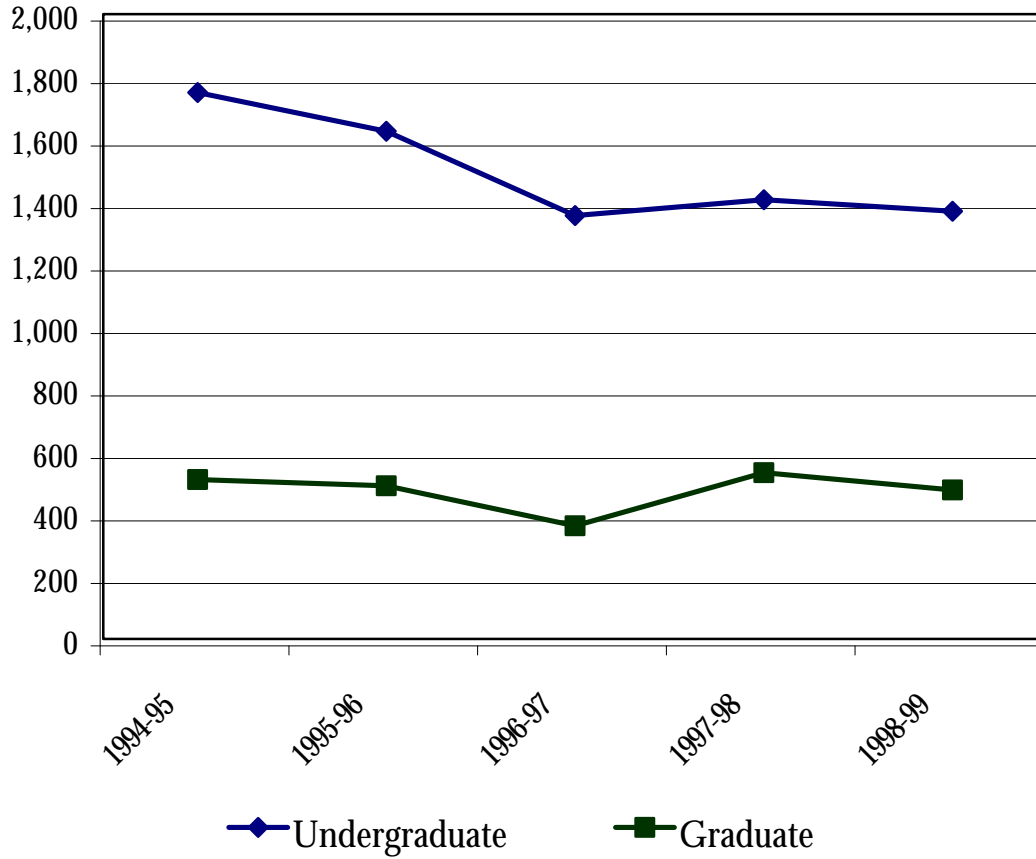

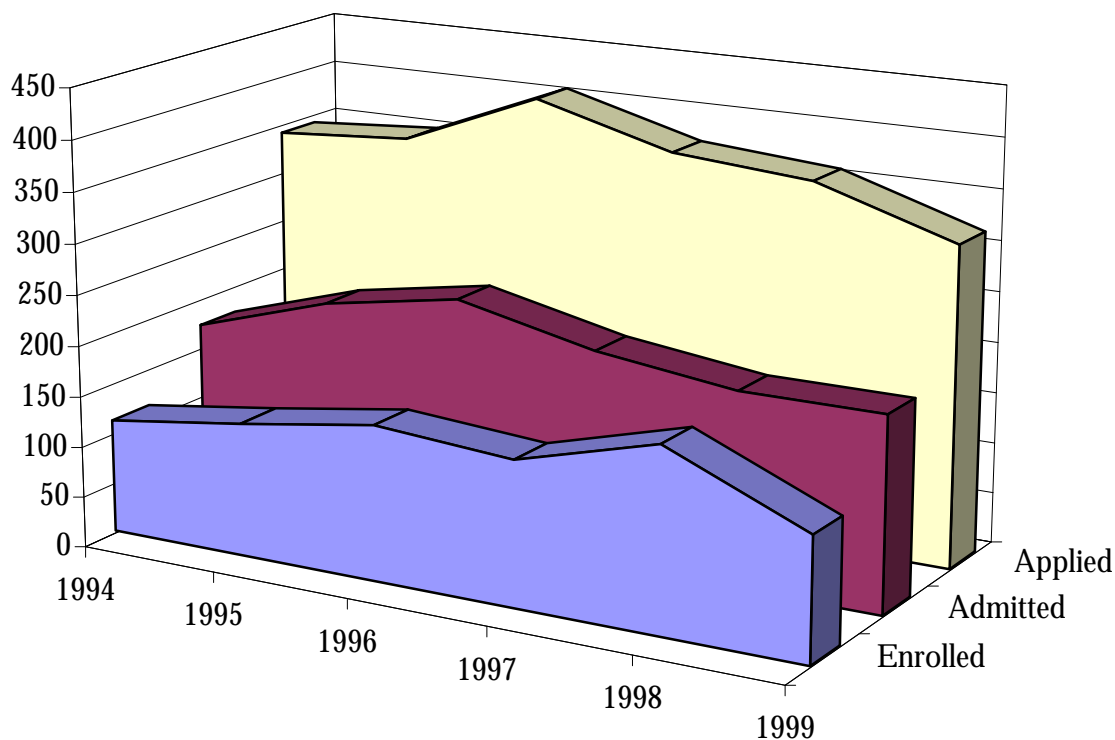

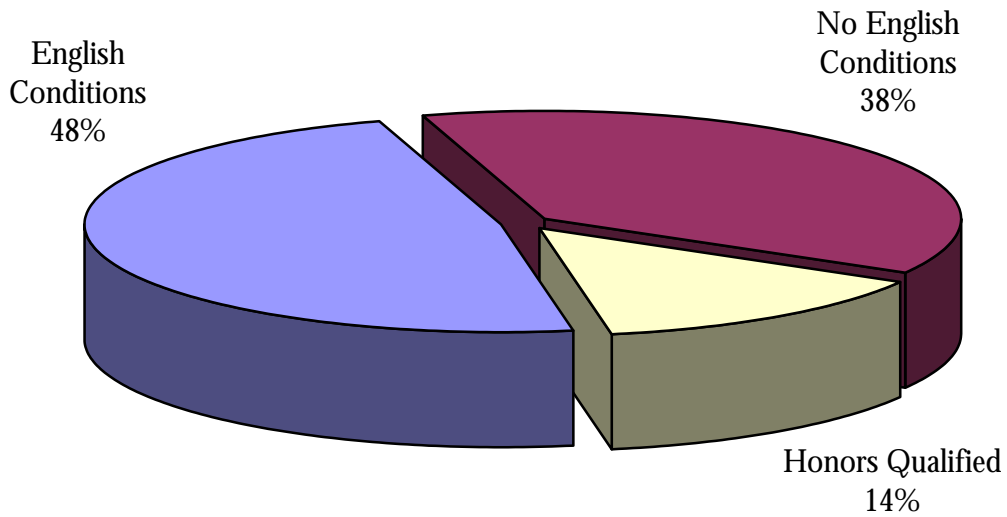

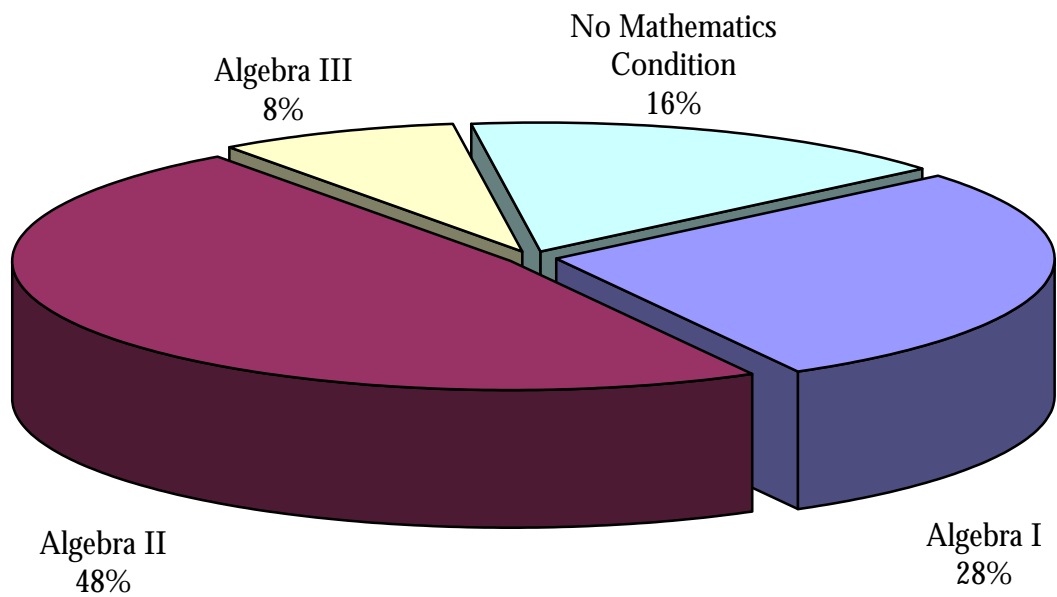

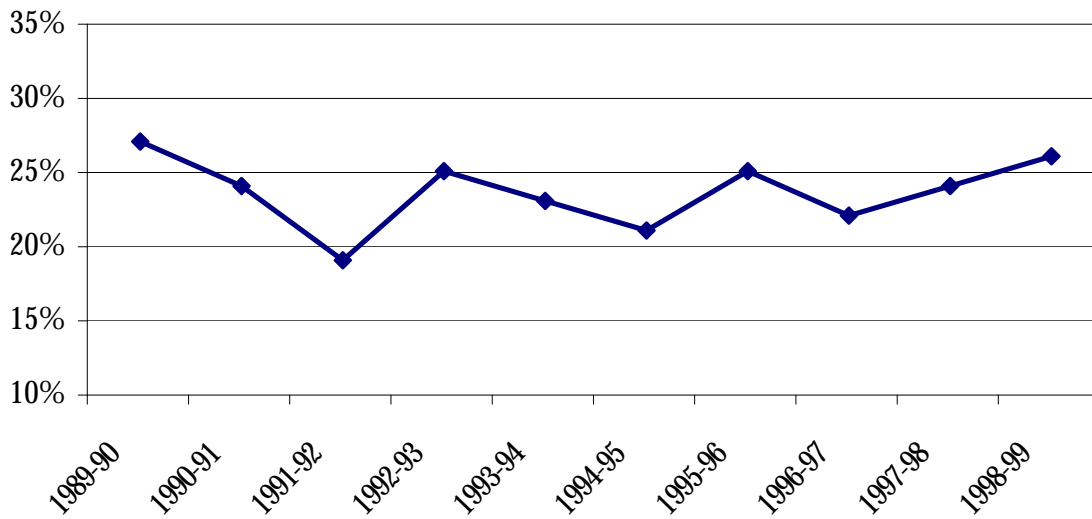
